


Cultivating statewide change by advancing progressive policy solutions

We launched a new proposal to create a statewide Child Savings Account program – which would advance equity and set kids up for lifelong economic success, particularly kids of color who face additional barriers to opportunity. Our work informed the legislature's action to increase the cash grant for basic assistance available through WorkFirst, the state Temporary Assistance

for Needy Families

program.

We propelled innovative, equitable solutions to flip our state's upside-down tax code – like modernizing and fully funding the Working Families Tax Credit and closing the tax break on capital gains – and built broad-based support through coalitions.
