- 1. Aged, Blind, & Disabled program (ABD) provides limited cash assistance to adults with low incomes and no dependents who cannot work and are either 65 or older, blind, or have a disability that would likely qualify them for federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI).
- 2. Diversion Cash Assistance is a program that provides cash assistance on a one-time per year basis for families with low incomes with temporary need that are not likely to need the longer-term Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. Emergent needs include shelter, transportation, food, medical care, child care, etc.
- 3. Family Support Services provide parents with aides and counselors; support to meet basic needs like food, clothing, transportation and employment; and in-home family preservation services for families that are at risk or in need of reunification.
- 4. Pregnant Women Assistance provides a cash grant to pregnant women with low incomes that are ineligible for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or State Food Assistance (SFA).
- 5. Vocational Rehabilitation Services target people who would like to work but have difficulty finding or keeping a job because of physical, sensory, cognitive or mental disabilities. The Division of



Vocational Rehabilitation within DSHS provides one-on-one counseling, job-skills assessments, placement support, training and education, and medical and psychological services.

6. Working Connections Child Care (WCCC) provides child-care subsidies to families with low incomes that are participating in WorkFirst activities, job search, or job-training programs.
